Crime Updates January

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business & community	11	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	4	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	26	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	26	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	6	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	2	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	11	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	5	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	26	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	9	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	13	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	6	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
